- Homer, *The Odyssey*, translated by E. V. Rieu, revised by D. C. H. Rieu (Penguin)
- Homer, *The Iliad*, translated by E. V. Rieu, revised by D. C. H. Rieu (Penguin) [or any other good translation, since this is not a set text – Martin Hammond’s prose translation is excellent, as is Robert Fagles’ verse translation]
- Virgil, *The Aeneid*, translated by David West (Penguin)
- Richard Jenkyns, *Classical Epic: Homer and Virgil*
- Andrew Wallace-Hadrill, *Augustan Rome*
- Cassius Dio, *The Reign of Augustus*, translated by Ian Scott-Kilvert (Penguin)
- Robert Hancock Jones, James Renshaw, and Laura Swift, *Greek Theatre and Imperial Image* (OCR textbook, published by Bloomsbury)

Required reading before you start the course:

- Homer, *The Odyssey*, translated by E. V. Rieu, revised by D. C. H. Rieu (Penguin)
- Matthew D.H. Clark, *Augustus, First Roman Emperor: Power, Propaganda and the Politics of Survival* [or an equivalent narrative history - see above]
- Suetonius, *Life of Augustus* – there's a decent translation here: https://penelope.uchicago.edu/Thayer/E/Roman/Texts/Suetonius/12Caesars/Augustus*.html#1

Highly recommended pre-course reading:

- Virgil, *The Aeneid*, translated by David West (Penguin) [You must ensure that you have finished reading this by the end of the Easter holiday]
- Homer, *The Iliad*, translated by E. V. Rieu, revised by D. C. H. Rieu (Penguin) [The *Odyssey* functions as a sequel to the *Iliad*. Don’t be afraid to skip/skip through Book 2]

- Cassius Dio, *The Reign of Augustus*, translated by Ian Scott-Kilvert (Penguin)
- Andrew Wallace-Hadrill, *Augustan Rome*
